The Campus Archive hired an Archivist after many years with no one in this position. We were able to put together funding from the library to hire a part-time one-year term limited archivist. Through the Inclusive History Project (IHP), we were awarded \$238,000 in funding in the amount of to increase this position to full-time and then further to add two full years to the term. With the crucial support of the IHP we now have a

full-time three-year term appointed archivist to support the research necessary to tell UM-Dearborn's inclusive story.

Another major accomplishment of Spring 2024 was the receipt of \$56,000 in grant awards from the IHP to fund the large-scale digitization of the archive's holdings of student publications, The Michigan Journal and Lyceum. This project will support IHP research by making materials more easily searchable, encourage alumni to reconnect with their time on campus, and create a greater sense of community between the current students and their predecessors.
