In March of 2021, the Library began slowly reopening its doors to students, faculty and staff of

UM-Dearborn. We kicked off by transforming the first floor to provide space for the Math Learning

Center tutors and Supplemental Instruction leaders offered face-to-face sessions in the Active Learning Classroom. The second floor opened in April with twelve reservable spaces for students to study. We continued to offer the reservable spaces through July, and in that time had 343 reservations by 87 different users. August saw the reopening of the Library Info Desk. The biggest change started on August 31st, when new and returning students came to the library and visited all four floors for the first time in nearly eighteen months!
